FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of the Baptism of Our Lord January 7 – January 13, AD 2024

e are surrounded by evil at all times. Our flesh is constantly looking for ways to rebel. The world is mercilessly putting temptation in our way and seeking to either draw us away from the faith or silence our confession so that it doesn't have to listen to the truth and be shown its wickedness. The devil tirelessly sets traps before us and stirs up all kinds of afflictions and distractions to abandon our hope in Christ. We must be careful not to confuse the crosses that we bear with evil. Evil is what leads us away from Christ. Suffering can do that. But more often, comfort and ease do that. These things can lead us to imagine that we don't need Christ. They can blind us to our need for salvation and our constant need of the Word of God and the Holy Communion. If our afflictions keep us near to Christ, then they are holy and salutary afflictions which we should receive in thanksgiving and faith. We pray in this petition that God would protect us from anything that would lead us away from Him and give us everything, even crosses, that draw us nearer to Him.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Lord's Prayer - Seventh Petition and Conclusion

The Seventh Petition - But deliver us from evil.

What does this mean? We pray in this petition in summary, that our Father in heaven would rescue us from every evil of body and soul, possessions and reputation, and finally, when our last hour comes, give us a blessed end, and graciously take us from this valley of sorrow to Himself in heaven.

The Conclusion – For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

What does this mean? This means that I should be certain that these petitions are pleasing to our Father in heaven, and are heard by Him; for He Himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us. Amen, amen means "yes, yes, it shall be so."
