verything we believe as Christians is built upon what God has said in His Word. All of our confidence in Holy Baptism comes from what Jesus Christ our Lord said and promised about it. Jesus very clearly told His disciples after His resurrection that He wanted all nations to be made disciples by being baptized. (Matt. 28:19) Jesus also very plainly promised that whoever believes and is baptized will be saved. (Mark 16:16) We don't have to try to figure out what Baptism is and does. Jesus tells us! And what an amazing treasure He gives us. With just a little bit of water the promises of Jesus' word are given to you. Baptism forgives you. Baptism rescues you from death and the devil by making you a child of God. Baptism gives you eternal salvation. All of these wonderful things God has chosen to do through Baptism. If you are baptized you can say with every last ounce of certainty that all of those things are true of you because God has said they are true of you. Rejoice, you who are baptized, because by your Baptism you have been saved!

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Sacrament of Holy Baptism

What is Baptism?

Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.

Which is that word of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matt. 28:19)

What benefits does Baptism give?

It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

Which are these words and promises of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:16)
