FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of The First Sunday in Lent - Invocabit February 18 – February 24, AD 2024

During Lent it is appropriate that we as Christians take up the practice of fasting, denying ourselves creaturely comforts so that we may learn to trust our Heavenly Father for all good things and train our flesh to resist temptation. Far too often we do exactly the opposite. We fast from the things of God so that we may fill our bellies with the things of the earth, things that do not satisfy and things that do not save, sometimes even things that are evil. For this we must repent and turn to the Lord Jesus who fasted from all evil things and who gave us that food which we should never fast from - the Holy Supper of Christ's Body and Blood, given and shed for you, for the forgiveness of sins. This food truly gives life. This food is the medicine of immortality for your body and your soul. God grant that we hear and believe and keep these words "Take, eat; drink of it all of you."

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Sacrament of the Altar:

What is the Sacrament of the Altar?

It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink.

Where is this written?

The holy Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and St. Paul write:

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you: this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."
