FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of Quinquagesima February 11 – February 17, AD 2024

The Office of the Keys is an astounding treasure which our Lord Jesus Christ has given to us Christians. It seems strange and even offensive to some that another person, who is a sinner just like everyone else, has been given the authority to forgive a person's sins with the full authority of God. But that is EXACTLY what Jesus said! "If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven." Jesus instituted a unique office in His Church so that you can actually hear His forgiveness spoken into your ears and know that it is as valid and certain as if Jesus Himself were the one speaking that word. It's not magic. It's certainly not because your father confessor is holier. It is because Christ has granted that authority to His Church on earth. It is how the Holy Spirit, in the Christian Church, daily and richly forgives all your sins and the sins of all believers. Do not doubt. Believe the promise of Jesus and go to your pastor to confess those sins which you know and feel in your heart so that your faith may hear and rejoice in the forgiveness of Jesus which your pastor has been commanded to speak to you.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Confession and the Office of the Keys:

What is Confession?

Confession has two parts,

First, that we confess our sins, and

second, that we receive absolution, that is forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

What is the Office of the Keys?

The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.

Where is this written?

This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." (John 20:22-23)

What do you believe according to these words?

I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.
