remembrance which provides us an opportunity to think about what Jesus has done for us. But that is certainly not what Jesus gave on the night of His betrayal. He Himself says, "this is My Body; this cup is the New Testament in My Blood". In this precious gift we receive the very Body and Blood that hung on the cross, were laid in the tomb, rose again from the dead, and now sit at the right hand of God. And all who receive these in faith receive nothing less than the forgiveness of all their sins. Indeed, we are to eat and drink being mindful of what Christ did. But even more, we are to be mindful of what Christ still does - He gives forgiveness to sinners by giving them what He sacrificed for them. Listen to the Words of Institution. Meditate upon them. Believe them. He spoke them for hearts terrified by their sins. He spoke them for you so that you might hunger and thirst for what He gives - His Body and His Blood, under bread and wine for us Christians to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of all of our sins.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Sacrament of the Altar:

Where is this written?

The holy Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and St. Paul write:

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you: this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?

These words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.

How can bodily eating and drinking do such great things?

Certainly not just eating and drinking do these things, but the words written here: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." These words, along with the bodily eating and drinking, are the main thing in the Sacrament. Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say: "forgiveness of sins."
