■oo often the inexpressible joy of Christ's resurrection on that first Easter is overshadowed with trivial (though fun) things like bunnies and eggs. The resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, who three days before had cried out, "My God! My God, why have you forsaken Me? It is finished!" literally changes our entire existence. Death and eternal judgment have been left completely powerless. True. We do see their work all around us. There is homelessness, death, war, disease. There are angry words and covetous thoughts. God's Word is despised and ignored. Christians are persecuted. Churches are shrinking. But none of that actually tells us anything other than the fact that we are still waiting for Christ to complete our salvation by returning for judgment. You, dear Christian, baptized into Christ Jesus, have absolutely nothing to fear in this life. Christ has saved you. He has promised that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor ANYTHING ELSE IN ALL CREATION can separate you from the love which He has poured out on the cross. You belong to Christ. You are free from the need to fear the devil's lies and scheming and treachery. You see them for what they are and you know their end. They will perish. But you, child of God, are and always will be with Christ. Praise be to Jesus!
