FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of The Fifth Sunday in Lent - Judica March 17 – March 23, AD 2024

t is our responsibility and joy as Christians, who have been saved by the Word of God that He graciously caused to be proclaimed to us, to support the continued preaching of that Word not only that we might be strengthened and kept in the true faith but also for the sake of our brothers and sisters in Christ and those who do not yet call upon Christ in faith. It is actually one of the reasons that the Lord blesses us with our daily bread - that we might share a portion with our pastor so that he and his family might have their daily bread and he can give his full attention to prayer, to the study of Holy Scripture, the preaching of the Word, and to providing pastoral care to everyone in the congregation. But too often, our hearts bristle at the idea of giving the tithe to support the care of the church and the pastor because we have things that we want and if we return our offerings of thanksgiving to the church, then we won't have it to use for ourselves or put aside for a rainy day. But that is to sow to the flesh. The giving of offerings is the way which God has provided to give thanks to Him and to demonstrate our trust that He will always provide our daily bread as we have need. Let us repent of withholding our offerings and so making it more difficult for the Word of God to be preached in our midst, and pray to God to lead us to cheerful, generous giving from the bounty which the Lord provides so that our pastor can devote himself to bringing us the Word of God.

The Catechism
