FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of Palmarum – Palm Sunday March 24 – March 30, AD 2024

ne of the great challenges to Christ's Church in our day is the rejection of authority. We revel in the false notion that we are our own god - deciding who we are, what our responsibilities are, and what is right and wrong. But such false thinking only leads to chaos and heartache. God has ordered creation for our benefit and in that order is great joy and peace. In the Church, Christ exercises His authority through the pastoral office. Your pastor is commanded to watch over the well-being of your soul. He is to instruct you, guide you, exhort you, reprove you, and encourage you in Christ. A pastor who takes these responsibilities seriously is a great joy and blessing to you. Receive him with joy and submit yourself to his authority because it was given to him by Christ to be a blessing to you so that you might remain with Christ always. But if we rebel against this authority and imagine that our pastor is just there to tell us what we want and has no business correcting us when we speak or act wrongly or directing us to true doctrine and godly living, then we are robbing ourselves of a great treasure and rejecting the authority of Christ Himself. Christ forgive us for rejecting those in authority over us and help us to submit ourselves in faith to those whom He has placed over us, including our pastors.

The Catechism
